VEC work

I have worked for the VEC for over ten years teaching Photography classes in Adult Education. I teach at the Loreto Centre in Crumlin. Ronanstown CDP and Donahies Community School in Donaghmede. I also teach Graphic Design programs in Donaghmede and have done so for the last ten years. I designed the community development course and implemented it in both Crumlin and in Clondalkin supporting access for all into the often difficult theoretical concepts involved. I am currently teaching the second module of an innovative film appreciation class in the Loreto Centre Crumlin. I have also designed a Film Making class which we are to pilot in early 2011. I facilitated the drafting of the Mentoring Program for Women's Studies students in conjunction with the CCEF, Loreto Centre Crumlin and UCD. The final Policy is currently being drafted.

Community development work

I have worked in community development since 2001. I began as a youth worker and as a development worker for Clondalkin Traveller's Development group working for human rights for The Traveller Community. I have worked as a development worker for the Women's Network and I am currently the coordinator there. I also worked as assistant director at belvedere youth.

University Lecturer

I am employed as an occasional Lecturer in UCD where I deliver modules on behalf of the Women's Studies outreach course. Over the last 5 years I have delivered Modules for Longford women's group, Ringsend Action Project, Loreto Centre Crumlin and Ronanstown CDP. I have also delivered Women's Studies Core Modules as well as modules in Sexualities and Film for UCD.

I volunteered for Women's Aid and for Habitat for Humanity for many years and I am an active participant in the Feminist Open Forum. I also run my own Photography Company and work as a consultant in lgbt equality theory.
